School Profile 2025 – 2026

Located in the heart of Duvall, Washington, Cedarcrest High School is a four-year public secondary school serving approximately 920 students in grades 9–12. As the only traditional high school in the Riverview School District, Cedarcrest is known for its commitment to academic excellence, inclusive community values, and student-centered learning.

With a graduation rate of 94% and top-tier proficiency scores in reading (89%) and math (54%), Cedarcrest ranks among the top 20% of public high schools in Washington State. Students have access to a wide range of Advanced Placement® courses and have an 80% AP exam pass rate.

Cedarcrest fosters a strong sense of identity and belonging through its relatively small size, allowing staff to build meaningful connections with students. The school offers robust extracurricular programs, including athletics in the Kingco Athletic Conference, student leadership opportunities, and a variety of clubs and activities.

The Red Wolf—Cedarcrest’s mascot—represents the school’s spirit of resilience, teamwork, and pride and the goal of empowering students to grow and thrive in a respectful, inclusive, and responsive environment.
